# FAMILY PROGRAMS

#### **PARENT CAREGIVER TRAINING**

This is a hands-on training program for Early Intervention (EI) to parents with kids in the EI program & classroom training to other parents, on brain damage, child development, behaviour modification, etc., to help them continue therapy at home, except their child's condition, & make the best of their family lives is a big part of our intervention. We're very pleased this went on smoothly all year round.

#### **MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES**

Raising a child with special needs is a highly stressful job & the parents need all the support they can get. Aiming to prevent burnout, mental illness, & to create a long-term support system between parents, we provide mother/father/sibling support groups & individual counseling sessions, conducted by our Mental Health Services team, this has been a transformative program for many families. It aligns with Goal 3 of SDGs, Good Health & Well being.

#### SKILL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

We've introduced this program to develop latent skills of mothers of children attending Tamahar's programs & are planning to expand that to include entrepreneurial skills training. This is aimed at helping mothers become financially active & self-reliant, realize their potential by turning their skills into a vocation. Currently, we have Embroidery, Tailoring, & Spoken English sessions. In the future, we want to add Computer classes. This aligns with SDG Goal 8, 'Decent Work & Economic Growth'.



## OUR STAFF, OUR LIFE FORCE




## **SUCCESS STORIES**

From Math and English to online storytelling, we are currently conducting sessions online for nearly 70 children enrolled in our programs.


### HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

**Thanks to our Donors** we were also able to procure Tablets for a few families in need of them. This ensured that their intervention continued without breaks for all children at Tamahar.














## EVENTS AND UPDATES



#### 1 Background

Tamahar Trust was formed on May 16, 2010. The Trust is primarily constituted to treat the children who are suffering from Autism spectrum, hyperactivity and attention deficit issues. The Trust is registered u/s 12AA of the Income-tax Act, 1961 (IT Act) vide registration dated April 25, 2011 and the trust is also registered u/s 80G of the IT Act. The Trust has applied for revalidation of its Section 12A Exemption and Section 80G Deduction Certificates.

#### **2 Significant Accounting Policies**

#### 2.1 Basis of preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern concept, under historical cost convention. The Trust follows cash basis of Accounting, as permitted under Section 145 of the IT Act except in the case of charge of assets as depreciation (as required u/s 32 of the IT Act).

#### 2.2 Recognition of income and expenditure

Incomes including donations, fees and other receipts are recognised in the books on receipt basis. Similarly, all expenses are recognised on the basis of payments made.

#### 3 Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Fixed Assets are accounted at cost of acquisition and depreciation on the same is charged on the Written Down Value method as per the provisions of the IT Act, read with Rules thereto.

#### 4 Others

The Trustees estimate that there exists no liability actual or contingent related to employee benefits, other than those accounted in the books.

The Activity of the Trust is exempt under IT Act. Hence, no taxes are paid nor any tax liabilty is anticipated.

#### 5 Previous Years figures

Previous year's figures have been regrouped, renamed and reclassified wherever required.


